

90-Day Roadmap (Sex Offense Cases)

The goal is to demonstrate treatment alignment, offense-cycle clarity, victim awareness, and a condition-realistic plan that matches the CRA's identified needs.

Critical deadline (sex offense cases)

The packet should be mailed to arrive at least 15 days before the hearing. The treatment section should be tabbed separately and easy to find.

If the client is on a treatment waitlist and cannot yet enroll, document the waitlist, the date of sign-up, and any facilitator confirmation. A documented waitlist is materially stronger than no posture at all.

Weeks 1–2	Treatment posture	▶ Document current enrollment or waitlist for CHANGE / REALIZE / other available program ▶ Identify facilitator(s) and request chronos where appropriate ▶ Gather prior treatment records and completion certificates ▶ Confirm any CASOMB-related requirements for county of release
Weeks 3–4	Road to Freedom + Good Lives Model (GLM)	▶ Workbook progress documented (specific chapters / exercises) ▶ Draft GLM 'good life goals' statement (primary goods and how they will be met prosocially) ▶ Map current programming to each good-life domain
Weeks 5–6	Offense cycle + risk map	▶ Written offense cycle with warning signs specific to this client ▶ List of high-risk situations and concrete interventions for each ▶ Technology / internet use rules tied to any conditions of parole
Weeks 7–8	Management plans	▶ Sex offense management plan (arousal, boundaries, supports, technology)

		▶ Victim-impact work summary in the client's own words ▶ Accountability circle identified with names and roles
Weeks 9–10	Continuity planning	▶ Identify CASOMB-certified providers in county of release ▶ Draft 'treatment continuity' letter of intent or pre-appointment where possible ▶ Polygraph posture addressed if relevant ▶ Housing and employment screened against likely conditions
Weeks 11–12	Finalization + hearing readiness	▶ Final packet assembled with treatment section clearly tabbed ▶ Mail packet to arrive at least 15 days before the hearing ▶ Two to three mock hearings including sex-offense-specific questioning ▶ Review likely Commissioner and DA questions

Additional Considerations

- **Identify CASOMB-certified providers in the intended county of release early — waitlists are common.**
- Screen the housing plan against likely conditions of parole (distance from schools, parks, daycare, etc.) and confirm the address qualifies.
- Technology and internet conditions are routine — the management plan should address device use, monitoring, and accountability.
- If there is a polygraph expectation in the county of release, address the client's posture toward it in writing.
- Victim-impact work should be in the client's own words and reviewed by counsel before it enters the packet.
